RESOLUTION No. 21

NOTICE OF PLAT AND STREET VACATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 26th day of June, 1956 the City Council of the City of Brookings, Oregon, adopted Resolution No. 21 initiating proceedings for the vacation of certain unimproved portions of the recorded plat of the City of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon, which said portions are therein described as streets and an alley, and are more particularly described as follows:

PART I: Those portions of Center Street and Park Avenue lying Southwest of a line drawn from the Southwest corner of Lot 1, Block 16, to the Northeast corner of Lot 4 of Block 13 and extending to the Southeast corner of Block B and the Southeast corner of Block A. Also that part of Lot 5, Block 14 lying Southwesterly of above said line.

PART II: That portion of Park Avenue lying between the West line of Fern Avenue and the Southwest corner of Block B and the Southeast corner of Block A, adjoining Block 13 on the North and Block B on the South.

PART III: The 20 foot alley extending from the center of Lot 12, Block 15 to the Northeast corner of Block B and the Northeast corner of Lot 23 of Block 12, all of which fronts on Block A, B, 12 and 15.

It is proposed that the streets will be replatted and rededicated in accordance with the plat attached to the above-mentioned resolution on file with the City Recorder and approved by the City Council, and this vacation proceeding is initiated for that purpose.

Said resolution, together with any objection or remonstrances and/or claims for damages which may be made in writing and filed with the City Recorder of the City of Brookings, Oregon, at her office in the City hall prior to the time and date of hearing will be heard and considered by the City Council at its regular meeting beginning at 8 o'clock p.m. the 14th day of August, in the Council Chambers of the City Hall in said city.

**RESOLUTION No. 21
RESOLUTION INITIATING STREET VACATION PROCEEDINGS**

The City Council of the City of Brookings, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, resolves as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to ORS 271.130, the City Council, on its own motion, does vacate certain unimproved portions of the duly recorder plat or the City of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon which unimproved portions of said plat are therein designated as portions of Center Street, Park Avenue and an alley, which portions to be vacated are more particularly described as follows:

PART I: Those portions of Center Street and Park Avenue lying Southwest of a line drawn from the Southwest corner of Lot 1, Block 16 to the Northeast corner of Lot 4 of Block 13 and extending to the Southwest corner of Block B and the Southeast corner of Block A. Also that part of Lot 5, Block 14 lying Southwesterly of above said line.

PART II: That portion of Park Avenue lying between the West line of Fern Avenue and the Southwest corner of Block B and the Southeast corner of Block A, adjoining Block 13 on the North and Block B on the South.

PART III: The 20 foot alley extending from the center of Lot 12, Block 15 to the Northeast corner of Block B and the Northeast corner of Lot 23 of Block 12, all of which fronts on Blocks A, B, 12 and 15; the vacation of which portions of said plat is for the purpose of replating or rededicating streets in said area in accordance with the copy of the replat attached hereto, which replat is hereby approved by the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 14th day of August, 1956, at 8:00 o'clock p.m. in the Council Chambers of the City Hall in the City of Brookings, Oregon, and they are hereby, fixed as the time and place for hearing on this vacation proceedings, and that the City Recorder be, and she is hereby, directed to publish notice of said hearing once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks prior to said hearing, and to post notice thereof in accordance with law.
