Enter Al Mincer

We were delighted to sign a petition Saturday, which will put the name of Al Mincer on the November ballot as an independent candidate for Curry County Assessor.

First, of course, we would like to point out the necessity of having more than one candidate run for an office—any office. A contested position gives the voters an opportunity to make a decision, and to choose on merits.

Secondly, we know Al Mincer. He is intelligent, trustworthy, progressive, and has experience dealing with figures through his present capacity as treasurer of the Brookings Plywood Corp.

Thirdly, Mincer has some experience where it counts—in the lumber business. He knows the value of timber, and he knows the score on re-appraisal.

We've got a few bones to pick with the incumbent, Mr. George Sutton, but this isn't the time to go into that. Our biggest beef right now is that Sutton apparently didn't have the interest in the position to file for re-election in the primary. Because of the lack of opposition, he received 326 write-in votes for County Assessor, which is hardly a "mandate of the people" In the four precincts of Chetco, Brookings I, Brookings II, and Ferrello, he received only 27 write-in votes.

Before the November election we'll have the time and inclination to go into the merits of each of the candidates. Our only point right now is that we are glad that Mincer has tossed his hat in the ring—if only to give the people a choice.
