THE PORT DISTRICT

SPECIAL ELECTION ON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 14th

\$225,000.00 has been appropriated by Congress and is now available to develop the Chetco River as a port. This appropriation was secured by local citizens. In so acting these citizens have not obligated any person to pay any money or perform any act. The election has been called by petitions signed by local electors and the expense of the election is paid by the county. Now some legal organization must be created to work with the U. S. Army Engineers in charge of constructing the project. Oregon laws provide that such an organization is a Port District. The district is administered by five commissioners, who are appointed by the Governor, and who serve without pay. Two of the appointed commissioners will be voted upon at the next November general election. The other three will be voted on at the 1958 general election. After being elected a commissioner holds office for four years.

The Congressional appropriations pay for all of the construction work required on the project. For its administrative expense the Port Commission may levy taxes. This administrative expense is not large in a port district of the size of the one here being created. The maximum tax levy which the commission may make is limited to ten mills. This is equivalent to Ten Dollars on One Thousand Dollars of taxable valuation. A port District is strictly non-partisan and non-political and is limited to the business of the port, which means that it is limited to such business as may grow out of water transportation. Port Districts in Oregon have proved to be of great benefit to their respective areas. In making its appropriations for port development Congress acts through the local Port Commission. Unless it can act with a local Port Commission, Congress is reluctant to make an appropriation. After working for some twenty years we have at last succeeded in getting a port established in this area. We believe that we should have a Port District so that we can assure ourselves that the present \$225,000.00 is spent in our best interests and so that we may proceed to secure other and following appropriations from Congress with which to build a first class port in this area. This statement and recommendation to vote "YES" at the September 14th special election is actively supported by the following named citizens and taxpayers, acting as a committee at large to help promote the area and secure the passage of this measure.
