## Report Weak Lumber Market

Hopes for improvement in the present slow lumber market during the last quarter of this year have been temporarily dispelled, according to Random Lengths, Eugene weekly lumber market. Tight mortgage money and stringent credit restrictions, which discourage home construction, will probably continue. Green fir dimension market has slowed to a walk as mills attempt to dispose of production with prices a secondary consideration. Canadian shipments are moving into the U. S. market at \$1 to \$2 under domestic mill prices.

Plywood holds at the \$72 pricing index. In spite of efforts to buy at lower levels, well-established mills have indicated they will go no lower, ceasing production, if necessary.
