Bond Purchase Up in Curry Cty.

Purchases of U. S. Savings Bonds in Curry county show a very sharp upswing in the reported \$23,172 tally of August, 1956, compared to \$9,184 of August a year ago.

And as far as calendar year purchases are concerned, so far in 1956, Curry people have bought \$247,262 worth of bonds according to Mr. George W. Minnaugh, state director, as against less when sales totalled \$112,368. Throughout Oregon the total sales show only a slight increase this year over last.

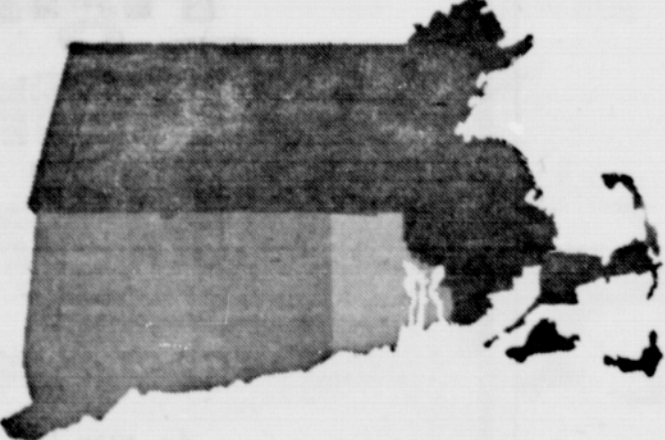

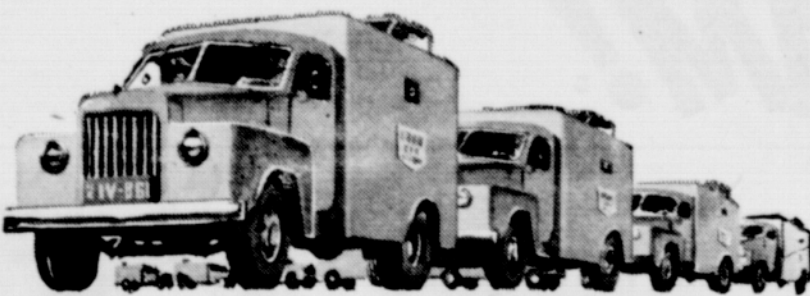
