Brookings Boaters To Race Sunday

A huge series of boat races is scheduled for the regatta at Orick California this week. The event is reportedly the largest ever staged in this area, and will include a gang of Brookings boaters.

Set to race are Tom Dent Barry Sage, Roy Pollard, Al Phillips, Don Vaughn and Bob Deffenbaugh. All will race their "B" hydroplanes, and several will go in their "B" Runabouts.

The races will begin on Saturday morning, at about 6:30 a.m. with the time trials, and will last all day. The main events, of course, will be on Sunday, beginning at about 10 a.m.

A novelty of the races will be the attempting to break the speed records on the "speed trap" set up in the fresh water lagoon. It is expected that between 500-600 boats may race in the two days. Over \$1000 worth of trophies will be given away, on what the sponsors call the biggest thing to ever hit the west coast in boat racing.

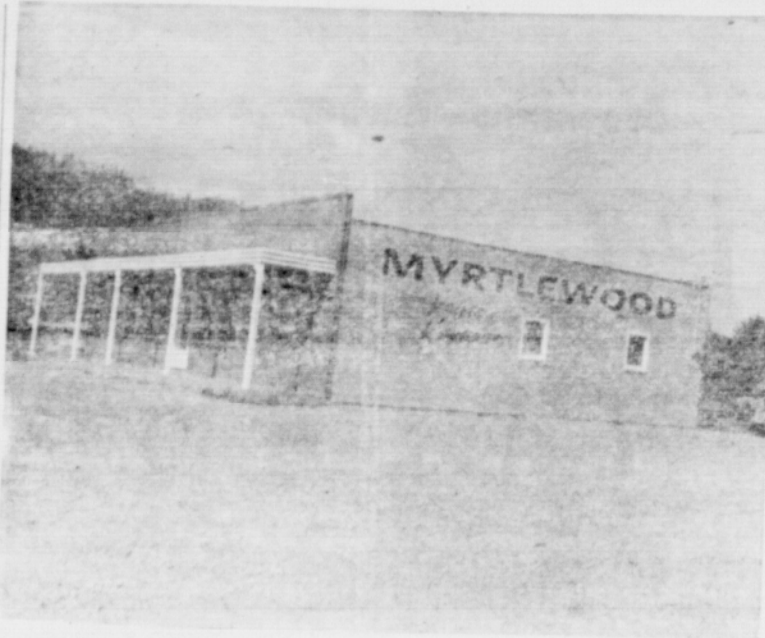
CLOSE UP SHOP


