ROAD DATA

The Pilot has addressed a letter to the map making section of the State Highway Travel Bureau asking that roads leading back from 101, in the southern part of the county, be included on their highway map folders. These are very definite tourist attractions as well as of general use. Those mentioned in the letter are the road up the Winchuck, at least to the Forest Service Camp at Bear Creek, the road back to Vulcan Peak and the one leading from near Red Flat down Hunters Creek to the highway.

DEL NORTE SCHOOLS

Our neighbors to the south in California are having school problems. In May of 1955 the county voted to authorize borrowing \$950,000 from the state to be used for schools and now the Crescent Union Elementary School District has set the date of December 11, 1956 when the voters will be called upon to authorize an additional loan of \$500,000.

Tourist Travel Found To Be on Increase

The State Highway Travel Division reports figures from 17 points of entry into Oregon show 1,096,000 out-of-state cars entered the state during the past 1956 checking season. This represented

The present building program calls for paying the sum of \$136,616.56 for the already added four classrooms at the Pine Grove school, the Bess Maxwell school in Crescent City, now half finished, amounting to \$536,930.20, \$267,485.81 for the Jos. Computed income from tourists travelling by car was \$127 million and that from travellers coming into the state by rail, bus and air, at \$14 million. Visitors were staying longer in the state this year than in '55 and each person spent more this year than they did last.

Figures continue to show that most visitors enter the state from California, followed in order by Washington, Canada, Idaho, Texas and Illinois.

Some 139,000 inquiries for Oregon literature were answered by the state as a result of their promotional advertising. This is the most in the bureau's 22 years.

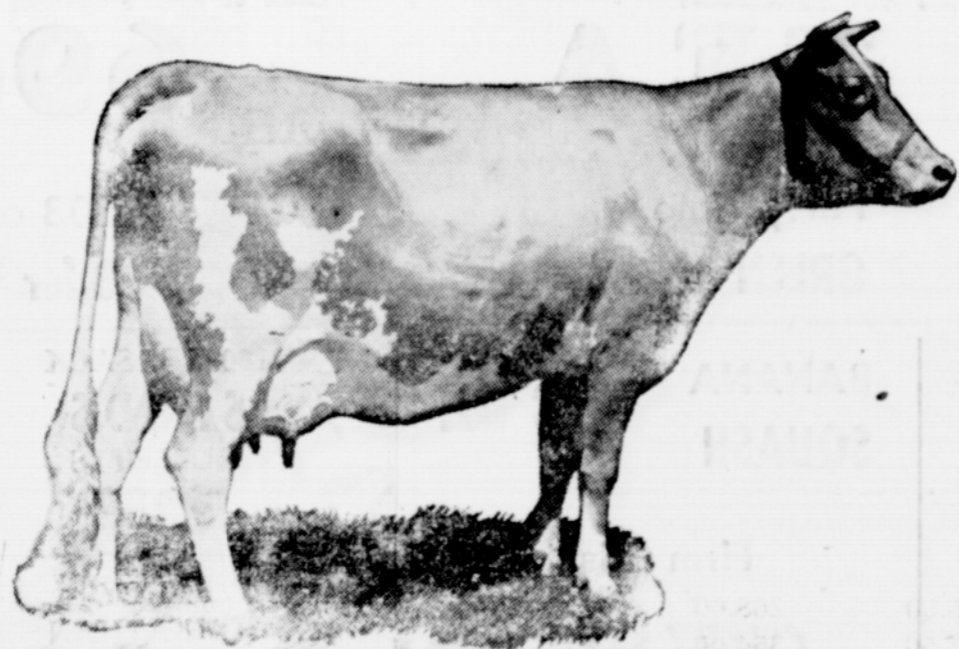
