Earl Malone is said to be getting along pretty good, after having wrenched his back, wrestling with his fishing boat. He's in Seaside hospital, Crescent City.

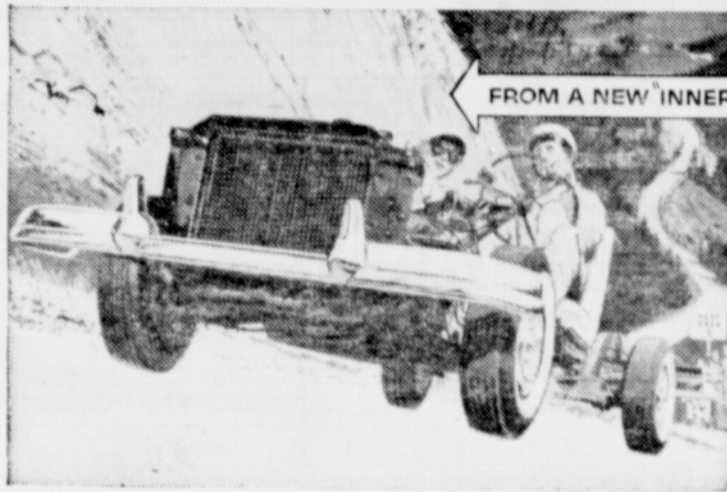

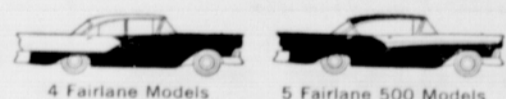

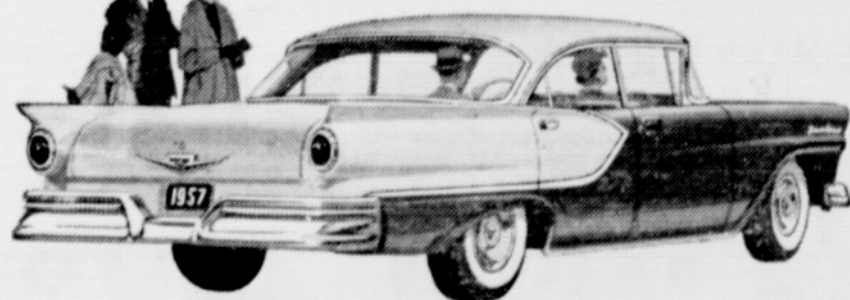
