## Timber Resources Given Review

CONTINUED EXPANSION OF ECONOMY IS EXPECTED

The TRR is geared to a continued rise in population; economic prosperity and higher living standards as reflected in a continued rise in gross national product; and expectations of peace but continued military preparedness.

One of the most fundamental assumptions is that population of the United States will be 210 million in 1975 and 275 million in year 2000, as contrasted to an estimated 165 million in 1955. This is an estimated increase of 67 per cent for year 2000 above that of 1955, but the trend is about the same as prevailed during the first half of the Twentieth Century.

Gross national product—the total national output of goods and services—is estimated to increase from 365 billion dollars in 1952 to 630 billion in 1975 and 1,200 billion in 2000. Although this would be an increase of 229 percent from 1952 to 2000, this trend also is about the same as the actual rate of increase over the past 50 years.

I wonder what Brookings will look like in year 2000. That isn't so far away—only 44 years. Our kids will be in their prime of mature life in year 2000.
