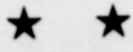

CHAUFFERS' LICENSES

Oregon chauffers may now make application for renewed licenses, which will be mailed after December 1, the Department of Motor Vehicles advises.

Renewals for 1957 will be accepted at all branch offices as well as at the main office in Salem and will become valid after December 15.

Between now and December 15 anyone not previously licensed as a chauffeur who makes application will receive a license which will expire December 31.

Each applicant for a chauffers license must hold a valid driver's license, the office said.
