Blend 1 cup soft shortening, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 2 eggs. Sift together and stir in 2 1/4 cups enriched Oregon flour, 2 tsp. cream of tartar, 1 tsp. soda and 1/2 tsp. salt. Mix in 1 cup ground filberts or walnuts, chill dough. Roll into "walnut-size" balls. Roll in mixture of 1/2 cup sugar and 2 tsp. cinnamon. Place 2 inches apart on greased baking sheet. Bake at 400° 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned but still soft.

Re-Appraisal Is Now Underway

We understand that the actual field work by the state tax commission agent on the re-appraisal of timber holdings in Curry county has not gotten underway. Two agents were reportedly on the job now, and others are expected later.

This is fine. We're for it one hundred percent. This county has needed a re-appraisal in the worst way—and has needed one for years.

But, we wonder, why the delay? The people of the county voted for the re-appraisal funds way back in 1952. Receipts from the levy were in the assessors office early in 1954, more than two years ago. We know too, that the contract with the state was held up for almost two years before it was signed. This county dropped from fourth to 14th on the list of counties on the state re-appraisal schedule. Some counties, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Morrow, and Wallowa, have already finished their re-appraisal. In Jackson county, the assessed value of timber increased from \$1,268,180 to \$3,531,920. In Col-

umbia county the value of timber increased from \$139,280 to \$1,376,723 (AN INCREASE OF MORE THAN 600 PERCENT.)

We're sure that we will see a marked increase in the value of Curry county timber—and we're sure that we will see a marked decrease in the burden that the rest of the taxpayers will have to shoulder. Or perhaps we will see increased revenues—to provide more services for all the people. At any rate we're elated to know that the project has gotten underway, and we're happy to know that a few citizens working as a group were instrumental in jarring county officials into expediting the matter.

We just can't go along with county assessor George Sutton's claim that he has been "instrumental in getting the Tax Commission re-appraisal and equalization program for Curry county underway." That is not a fact—and that is why we go along with Al Mincer for county assessor. Mincer, we know, will never be content to just sit back and watch the world go by.
