Report Annual Rainfall at 80.98 Inches

The Brookings Chamber of Commerce is preparing an industrial survey to be used in showing potential industrial interests just what the area has to offer.

One portion of the survey completed shows information from the U. S. Weather Bureau. The average rainfall in Brookings is 80.98 inches per year.

The total snowfall reported in 16 years shows a mean of 1.1 inches. The mean temperature in the 16 year period shows a 52.4 figure.

The mean maximum is 60.3, and the mean minimum is 44.4. The highest temperature recorded here in 17 years is an even 100 degrees while the lowest ever recorded is 19 degrees.
