

Bruins finish winning season

The Brookings-Harbor Bruins wound up a winning season and their first season Friday night in the rain, dumping Gold Beach by a 13-7 count.

Coach Doug MacFarlane and his charges proved that the earlier victory over the Panthers was no fluke. He proved that the Brookings team had come a long way in the short time since football was initiated in the school here. The Bruins ended the season with a won three, lost two record—far better than expectations, and even better than most

season wishful thinking.

The game Friday night was a good one, interesting to watch, despite a torrential downpour in the second half, coupled with hail in abundance and a wet muddy field.

The Panthers started right down the field, stringing together five first downs with Mike Melendy and Bob Parrott knocking off yardage in five yard chunks. But with Gold Beach threatening Brookings put a halter on the drive with halfback Jerry Fox intercepting a pass right on the goal

line, and dashing down the sidelines for 70 yards to the Gold Beach 30.

A couple of plays later Ron Lane pitched a perfect strike to Fox, who caught the ball on the four and stepped over to score the first Brook TD. Ron McCabe ploughed over for the extra point. The first quarter ended shortly after that, with Bob Parrott again running Gold Beach out of a hole.

However, Gold Beach was forced to punt to the Brook 25, and the Bruins took off on another of their patented razzle dazzle double reverse pass play, that nearly scored for them in the Eagle Point tilt. After the reverse Lane took the ball and flung it 40 yards downfield to a waiting Dave Moore, who was all alone. He sped to the Gold Beach 5 yard line where he was hit from behind, fumbling, with the Panthers recovering.

Gold Beach got out of the hole with a run by Parrott, but the ensuing punt was blocked neatly by Al Pate, who recovered near the Gold Beach goal line. McCabe took the ball to the four, but Fox fumbled just as he was about to cross the goal on the next play, with Gold Beach again saving themselves. Brookings was again approaching the end marker when the half ended.

The third quarter started off with a neat note for the Brooks, with a Lane pass to Jerry Anderson gained 30 yards. Lane followed with a 10 yard run, but a fumble gave the Panthers the ball again. The rains came, and the players slogged through the mire for the rest of the contest.

Brookings second score came late in the third stanza when little McCabe took off around end for 35 yards, his legs pumping like pistons. The pass try for the extra point failed.

The game went on in the rain and hail throughout the fourth quarter, neither team getting any advantage, due mostly to fumbles and penalties.

With only 34 seconds left Gold Beach managed to score from the one on a short run. A pass play netted the extra point. And the game ended following the Gold Beach kick off.

The Brookings-Harbor team had whipped Gold Beach 14-0 in their

previous outing. Barring a few costly fumbles, this game would have ended in about that same vein.
