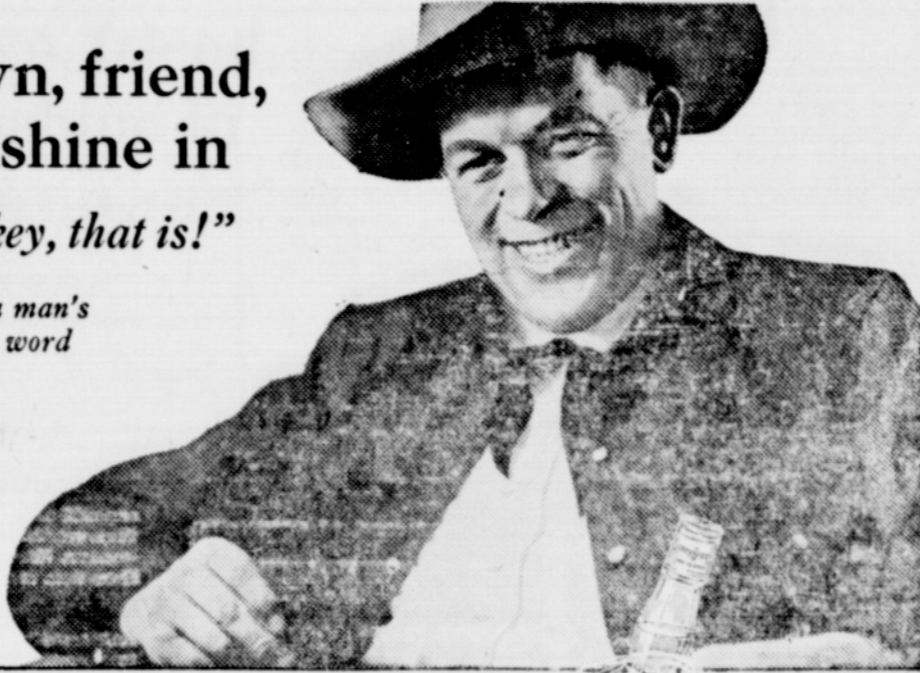

After art week, the studio will remain open to members at all times and occasional shows will be planned. One interesting exhibit tentatively planned is the showing of Serigraphs by Clyde Wood. Wood Los Angeles artist who is highly recognized for the fine work in the serigraph, or silk screen media. Wood also, was the artist that wrote the series of articles on Art in Every Day Life for the Pilot.

Other exhibits will possibly be one man shows of works of all the members, exhibits of neighboring artists and children's art.
