NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 35 of the City of Brookings, Oregon, the City Council gives notice that it will hold a public hearing in the City Hall at November 20th, 1956, at 8 p.m. for the purpose of giving all persons interested and the general public, an opportunity to be heard on a petition by J. T. Jacobs and Ruth Jacobs to rezone the following described property from R-1 to C-1:

That portion of Tax Lot No. 13 located in Government Lot 2 (the SW 1/4 of the NW 1/4) in Section 6, Township 41, South, Range 13 West, W.M., in the City of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon; said portion being described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of said Tax Lot 13, said point being at the intersection of the South line of Easy Street and the Easterly line of U. S. Highway 101 (Chetco Avenue);

Thence following the Easterly right of way line of said highway, Southeasterly, approximately 200 feet to the Westerly line of that area which is presently zoned "C-1";

Thence following said Westerly zone line, Northeasterly 200.0 feet;

Thence Northwesterly, parallel and 200.0 feet from, when measured at right angles, from the said Easterly highway right of way line approximately 150 feet to a point on the South line of Easy Street;

Thence following said street line, West approximately 240 feet to the point of beginning.

This hearing will be held under authority of Title 21, Chapter 227, Oregon Revised Statutes.
