Curry county students number 27, eight more than last year.

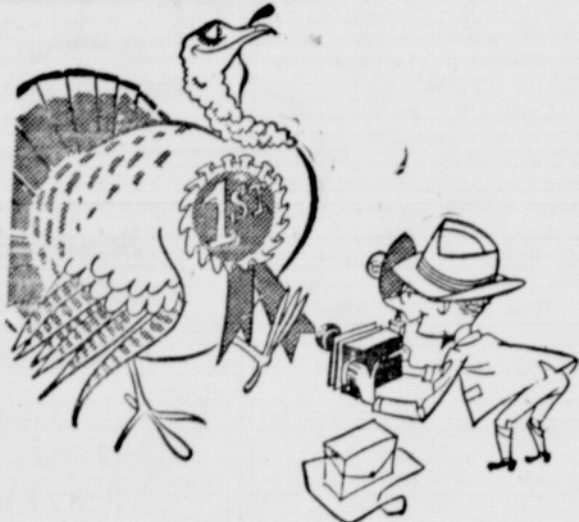

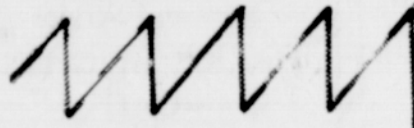

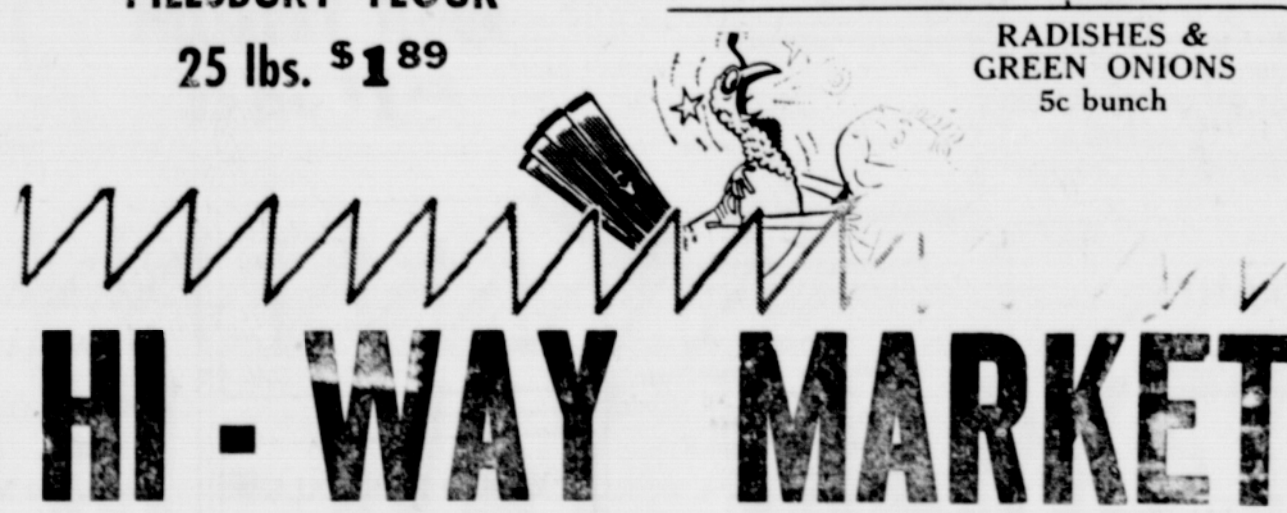
