# PROSPECTS LOOK GOOD FOR BUCKETBALL SQUAD

## First Game Set For December 1

Things look fairly bright bas

ketballwise at the Brookings-Harbor high school this year. A new coach, Calvin Pace, will have a bevy of returning lettermen back to start off his first season here. This year the Bruins will be in

a league, for the first time in the history of the school, which should make interest in the sport at an all time high.

Coach Pace will have four of the five regulars back from last year's good team, plus two that played a good deal of varsity ball and plus three boys that have transferred to Brookings from other schools.

Returning lettermen are guards Stan Gribble and Jerry Anderson, both who are seniors and three year letterwinners. A third senior is Rod Rush, a forward, who was a two year letterwinner.

Other letterwinners back are three juniors, Ron Bullock, who played regular for much of the season, as a forward, and Jerry Fox, a fireball guard, and Marvin Bullock, rangy forward and center, who was developing well at the end of the season.

Besides the six returning lettermen is Ron Lane, a two year letterwinner at Gold Beach at guard and Bill Workinger, who played with the Soph. J. V.'s at Marshfield for one year. A third transfer is Gary Galambos, who moved up from California and is an unknown quantity thus far.

Missing from last year's squad is tall Gary Coates, who played varsity center. Six boys, all of whom played J. V. ball last season are out for the varsity this year. Several are expected to stick with the squad. The J. V. members trying out are Ray Wallen, David Western, Jim Campbell, Harrison Hale, Fred

Anderson and Ray Hansen. Anderson and Hansen are sophomores.

Missing from last year's squad is Coach Art Guthrie, who coached the Brookings-Harbor squad for 11 years.

On paper Coach ace has a strong contingent back, but no real height has been shown. Generally speaking, however, the team speed looks good.

In the league, the Brooks face some real competition too. Eagle Point, a strong team last year, has most of its aces back, and on paper they figure to be very strong.

Other teams in the newly formed Rogue League are Rogue River Glendale, Phoenix and Illinois Valley. Pace has scheduled a full 22 game schedule which includes four games with each of the league members except only two with Glendale.

The league games will be played on a home and home basis, with games on both Friday and Saturday nights, with the visiting team staying over.

However, only the Friday night games will count in league standings. In other words only ten games will count in the league standings.

The first games of the season will be at Eureka, on Saturday, December 1. The first home game will be Tuesday night, December 4, when Crescent City plays here. The first home league game will be Rogue River here on Friday December 14.

Coach Pace has been a basketball coach for the past six years, since his graduation from Brigham Young U. He coached two years at Joseph, Oregon and four years at Elgin, Oregon. Coach Doug MacFarlane will coach the JV squad, while Mr. Duff and Jess Thurmond will coach the seventh and eighth graders.

Unlike the traditional touring printer, Wes was a sober, conscientious and untiring workman and had it not been for him, many Reporters would not have come off the presses nor been distributed. He was then affiliated with Reuben Young, and when the paper was sold to the Burtons, he continued on, equally sober, conscientious and untiring.

Eventually, he started a little shop of his own which with Mrs. Sibley, and known as the "Typo-print" flourished and it was at his beloved presses there that he was stricken with a heart affliction about a week ago.
