Notes on Thanksgiving

"George Washington" says Pastor Galambos, "not only asked his countrymen to attend church on the first Thanksgiving, but he went himself, though many others stayed at home."

"Washington's diary for Nov. 26, 1783, contained this entry: 'Being the day appointed for Thanksgiving, I went to Saint Paul's Chapel, though it was inclement and stormy. Saw few people at church!'"

"The first President had seen the crimson-stained snow at Valley Forge," continues the pastor. "He realized when some of his own men deserted and others proved traitors that God himself must give the victory. Therefore he went to church on the first Thanksgiving Day to praise the bounties of His God; yet most of his neighbors in Virginia let the weather keep them from joining their countrymen in thanking the Almighty for founding this nation."

"Human nature does not change; on Thursday of this week, when the President asks our blessings which have been heaped upon us, by far the most people of our country will have little time or thought for the gracious God who since the days of Washington, has made the United States the mightiest, the wealthiest, the most blessed of all countries."

"Ingratitude is a grievous sin. It has helped topple mighty empires. It has provoked war and destruction; it has ruined promising lives. As Americans, let us heed the plea of our President and use Thanksgiving Day for its intended purpose: to gather in God's House and thank Him for our National blessings and to implore His continued help and blessing."

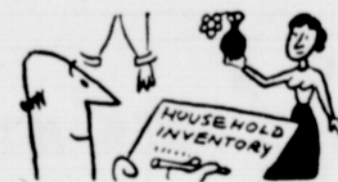
GOULD THROWS FIRST BALL
