Bruins beat Crescent, lose game to Eureka

The Brookings Bruins got off to a good start in the 1956-57 basketball season, losing to a strong Eureka team and then edging out a good Crescent City squad by one point, 35-34.

Against Eureka it was a combination of a lot of things. Mainly, though the Loggers just had too much class for the Bruins.

Dennis Giuntini pumped 20 points through the hoops, as Eureka moved to a 1948 first period lead, and a 29-18 half time lead to win 56-37. Eureka was strictly deadeye in the Saturday night encounter, while the Bruins had trouble finding the hoop. Scoring was evenly divided among the Brook regulars, with Ron Lane netting eight, Bill Workinger, Jerry Anderson, and Ron Bullock each six.

Against the Del Norte Warriors it was a different tale, however. Del Norte had opened their season Friday by trouncing Illinois Valley 54-26, and came up to Brookings for a victory.

Brookings took an early lead, held it by one point at the half, and managed to keep the Warriors from ever catching up, except with only about two minutes left a long shot by Bill Sullivan tied up the score.

The Bruins moved right back and front—and stayed there. They stalled out the last 40 seconds without letting a Crescent man touch the ball.

Stan Yaackamouth was easily the best man the Del Norters had. Besides dropping in 15 points his floor play was excellent, and he was in Brookings hair all night.

The Bruins had a few aces too, though. Coach Cal Pace, in his first game before the home crowd, used six men throughout the game, and they looked very smooth for this early in the season.

Brookings shooting average wasn't bad, about .406, but they found a cover on the hoop as far as free throws went, netting only 9 out of 22, and only three out of 10 in the crucial second half.

Jerry Anderson, veteran guard, was high scorer with 10 points, followed by Bill Workinger with 9, and Ron Lane with 8, Marv Bullock, Ron Bullock, and Stan Gribble all contributed mightily to the victory though.

The Brookings JV's did the same as their bigger colleague, losing to Eureka 45-30, and nosing out Crescent 38-35 on a fourth quarter spurt, which saw them come from behind 31-22, scoring 16 points in the final frame, while holding the Junior Del Norters to 5 points.

Little Jim Gribble was the whole show in the final quarter, dipping in 10 out of 10 free throws in the last quarter, making his high total for the night of 18 points.

Coast Group Plans Annual Meeting

Early elimination of the Coast Highway bottlenecks and better means of increasing salmon and steelhead runs in coastal streams are major items on the agenda at the annual director meeting of the Oregon Coast Association at Newport, December 8 and 9.

Delegations from Clatsop, Tillamook, Lincoln, Lane, Douglas, Coos and Curry counties in Oregon and from Del Norte County, California, and Pacific County, Washington, will be present as well as representatives of the County Courts.

Directors will discuss the possibility of obtaining legislative action at the 1957 session if necessary to attain these two important factors in the growth and welfare of the Coast, according to Otto Effenberger, Tillamook County Judge, and President of the Association.

AA water level route between Washington and California points on U.S. 101 is imperative in the immediate future, the Tillamook County Judge said, and must take its place high on the over-all program for road improvements in Oregon. A definite and sure means of increasing the salmon and steelhead runs to previous proportions, too, he said, warrants the concerted efforts of the seven counties.

The Directors' meeting will open with an informal discussion Saturday evening, December 8, in the lounge room of Willer's Motel, followed by formal sessions Sunday morning beginning at 9:30 in the Driftwood Room at the Gateway Cafe.
