Social Security Changes Listed

Recent changes in the Social Security Act now make it possible to pay monthly benefits to disabled children beyond the age of 18, according to Carlos L. Hunsinger, manager of the Eureka office of the Social Security Administration.

Under the old social security ended when the child reached age 18. For most children, this provision, benefit payments to a child vision still holds. A change in the law, however, now provides for the payment of benefits under certain conditions to a disabled child after age 18 if he became disabled before age 18. It also provides for the payment of benefits to the mother of such a disabled child, regardless of her age, provided she has the child in her care.

To be entitled to these benefits, the disabled child must meet the following requirements:

- (1) He must be the natural child, step-child, or adopted child of a deceased or retired worker who had been covered by the Social Security Act.
 - (2) He must be so severely disabled that he is unable to engage in any substantial gainful activity, and his disability must be of long-continued and indefinite duration. Also, as indicated above, he must have become disabled before he was 18.
 - (3) He must be unmarried, and dependent upon the deceased or retired worker for support, as of the time of the worker's death, or at the time when his own application for benefits is filed.
- Although benefits to disabled children over 18 will not be payable until January 1957, applications for those benefits may be

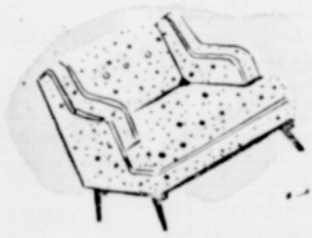
