

Christmas Recipe

CHRISTMAS LACE

Basic Sweet Dough:

- 2 Cakes yeast
- 1 cup milk, scalded and cooled
- ¼ cup sugar

- ¼ cup shortening
 - 2 eggs
 - 3-½ cups sifted enriched Oregon Wheat flour
 - 1 teaspoon salt
- Dissolve yeast in milk. Add bread. The spicy (crunchy filling

eggs, sugar, shortening, salt and 2 cups flour. Beat well. Add remaining flour and mix well. Knead on floured board until smooth and elastic. Place in greased bowl and let rise until double in size. Roll out on lightly floured board into rectangle 12 x 15 inches. Place filling down center 4 inches of dough. At each side of filling, make 2-inch cuts into dough. Cross alternate strips across center. Seal ends. Let rise until double. Bake at 375° 30-35 minutes.

Filling:
Cook together for about 3 minutes. Cool before spreading on dough.

- 2 cups apples, chopped
- 1 cup raisins, ground
- 1 cup dark brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon

Using the same basic sweet dough recipe used for the Christmas Lace you can easily prepare this traditional Slavic holiday teams perfectly with eggs, bacon

and hot coffee for breakfast.

POTICA

Use one recipe of Basic Sweet Dough. Let rise twice. After second rising, roll into rectangle 8 x 20 inches. Spread dough with filling.

- Filling:**
Cook for 1 minute and cool . . .
- ½ cup honey
 - 1 cup nuts, finely chopped
 - ½ cup butter
 - ½ cup cream
 - 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 - ½ teaspoon cloves
 - ½ teaspoon nutmeg
 - 1½ cups cut up raisins
- Roll dough up like jelly roll. Seal thoroughly. Lengthen roll by gently stretching. Coil it into a huge "snail" to fit a 10" heavy iron skillet. Let rise until double in bulk. Brush with slightly beaten egg white mixed with a few drops of water. Sprinkle crushed sugar and cut up almonds. Bake at 350° 45-50 minutes. Serve warm.

WHEAT TREATS
SPRITZ COOKIES

- 1 cup soft butter
- ¾ cup sugar
- 3 egg yolks
- 1 tsp. vanilla or almond flavoring
- 2¼ cups sifted enriched pastry flour or 2½ cups all-purpose flour

Cream butter, add sugar—mix well. Add egg yolks, flavoring—beat well. Add flour, blend well with fingers. Force dough through cookie press on to ungreased cookie sheet. 400° for 8-10 mins. 5 dozen cookies.

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No Market Found For Green Fir

Another week of extremely low demand has brought a jittery Green mill market that can easily develop uncontrollable convulsions in the absence of improvement during the next two weeks. Specified business is not sufficient to maintain production and shipping schedules and about the only outlet for Green mill production and shipping has been transit car distribution, but planned market withdrawal in whole or part by transiteers until there is some semblance of market stability means a shrinkage in this mill outlet. Unquestionably, a large number of transit cars are enroute, many of which are becoming more and more difficult to sell, even at reduced prices.

Weather conditions throughout the producing region have been conducive to unabated Fir lumber

production and in conjunction with demand at the lowest point in years, have prevented market pickup or stability.

Fir Studs, consistently weak but fairly steady for the past month are developing additional weakness with some mills reducing prices in order to move meager production.

Presently, transit car distribution is the major restricted market outlet for the bulk of Green mill production and in its present condition, there is hardly any comparison between buying and selling prices.

At no time during the past few years has there been such a lack of buying interest and while some of the slowness can be attributed to inventory time, present conditions are largely the result of the "hard money" policy of the Federal Reserve Board.

Except for a few instances of slightly more business this week from the Midwest, the country-wide volume of retail yard buying from the large Fir mills has been extremely low. Generally, a combination of bad weather, slack business, and sufficient inventory for present needs are no incentive to buy and mill prices are no object when yards are not ready to buy. Advanced buying is becoming a lost art and although profitable yards prefer to buy as needed and pay going market prices.

Except for Selects and Common Board, the market for all other items and grades of Ponderosa Pine and associated species continues extremely dull.

Most Fir Plywood plants have failed order files for Sanded stock at prices based on the \$67 index for ¼" AD SOIS. Following the seasonal slowdown in demand for form lumber, the Sheathing market is weak and production still heavy.

Christmas Recipe

MINCEMEAT DROP COOKIES

- 2½ cups sifted enriched flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup shortening
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup mincemeat

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cream together shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs and blend well. Stir in mincemeat. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture, mixing well. Drop by teaspoonfuls on greased baking sheet. Bake in moderately hot oven (400 degrees F.) 10 to 12 minutes. Makes about 6 dozen 2-inch cookies.

ALL NATIONS CAKE

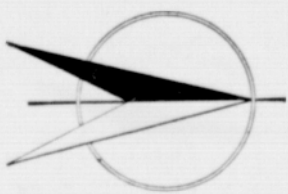
Bake a cake in star-shaped mold. Frost top of cake with white frosting and sides with yellow; sprinkle graded unsweetened chocolate ¼ inch in from edge. Decorate with marzipan dolls and banners saying "Merry Christmas" in several languages. Cut 1 circle of heavy white paper the diameter of cake plate and another 1½ inches larger in diameter. Make cuts 1½ inches deep, 1/8 inch apart, around outer edge of paper circles; then curl cut strips by drawing quickly over edge of scissors. Place on plate and arrange frosted cake on paper frill.
