Millions to See Coast Beauties Over TV Stations Around Nation

Millions of prospective vacationists and home seekers will see Oregon's spectacular shoreline and its recreational advantages during the next few weeks over television stations throughout the nation.

Three prints of a 15 minute travelogue in sound and color depicting the entire area from Brookings to Astoria are now being booked by TV stations, according to Judge Otto Effenberger president of the Oregon Coast Association, producers of the film.

Coast residents receiving KVAL-TV, Eugene, Channel 13 will see the film Saturday evening December 22 at 5:10 o'clock, Effenberger said, and KOIN-TV, Channel 6 at Portland has reserved the film for shortly after Christmas, exact time to be announced later.

In the first 10 days after notice of the travelogue's availability was sent out requests for showing the film were received from the following stations: KOOLT, Phoenix, Ariz.; KOLO-TV, Reno, Nevada; KHSL-TV, Chico, Calif.; KMSO-TV, Missoula, Mont.; KSL-TV, Salt Lake City, Utah; KOVR-TV, Stockton, Calif.

Copies of the film now are in the hands of the Eugene, Salt Lake and Stockton stations. Additional notices will be sent out after the first 100 western stations have been notified, Effenberger said, and the three films

are expected to be in use constantly during the next year.

An invitation to write for further information will be answered from those seeing the films, with a copy of the association's 36 page Oregon Coast travel guide, off the presses January 10, Effenberger said. A total of 125,000 of these guides were ordered for the coming year.
