

751 Licenses Suspended

Licenses of 751 Oregon drivers were suspended last month, the Department of Motor Vehicles reported today.

The suspension list included 270 drivers who were convicted of driving while intoxicated, a charge which calls for mandatory suspension under state law.

The department's driver license

division suspended another 408 licenses on court recommendation or discretionary action by officials.

The latter category included 101 persons who lost their licenses temporarily because of too-frequent accident or violation involvement.

Repeat offenders, termed "repeaters", received suspensions only after interviews by driver im-

JV SQUAD WINS TWO

The JV squad sped to a 16-7 first quarter lead and easily beat Rogue River on the Brookings floor Friday night. Paced by Jim Gribble, who netted 12 points the Brooks just didn't let the young Chieftons get close.

Gary Midwood made six points in the first quarter, while Fred Anderson and Jim Campbell each added four to push the Brooks way out in front. Midwood finished with six, Campbell had seven, and Anderson had 10 points.

Against Gold Beach a good first quarter, 10-6, didn't hold up as Gold Beach pushed to a 18-15 half time lead. The score was deadlocked going into the last period, but then the Junior Bruins turned on the heat and won going away. They outscored Gold Beach 9 to 6—all on gift tosses. Fred Anderson dropped in four, Campbell three, and Gribble two free shots in the last period. Anderson was high point man with 12, while Campbell had 10 and Gribble 8.

BROOKS WIN 5th IN ROW AT SAT. GAME

The Brookings Bruins swept both games during the past week end, and pushed their winning streak to five. One of the games, Friday night against Rogue River was a league game, leaving Brookings undefeated thus far in league play.

Friday night the Bruins "double teamed" a weak Rogue squad, and won as they pleased 61-31. Saturday night the Gold Beach Panthers provided a little sterner opposition, at least in the first half. However, coach Cal Pace's boys pushed through to a nine point win 44-35.

One more game faces the Brooks before the holidays. They tangle with Glendale here Friday night in a league encounter. After that they are off until Saturday night, January 5th, when Gold Beach visits the Brookings court. Glendale provided a good test for Brookings last week when the locals won by a 42-34 margin.

The JV squad continued the same pace as the varsity, winning both weekend encounters, sweeping by Rogue River 44-28, and nipping Gold Beach by 35-32 count, making patented last quarter surge, after going into the final period all knotted up at 26 all.

The Varsity game with Rogue River was interesting to watch in one respect, although it was never close. Coach Cal Pace used two separate teams, alternating quarters. The first quarter the squad consisting of Harrison Hale, Gary Galambos, Ray Hansen, Marv Bullock, and Jerry Fox set the pace, netting 16 points, while letting the Chieftons only have six. Bullock, Hale and Galambos did most of the scoring.

The second quarter saw an aggregation consisting of Bill Workinger, Ron Bullock, Ron Lane, Jerry Anderson, and Stan Gribble adding 11 points to the Brook total, while Rogue River managed to pick up another six points.

The first five came in again in the third quarter, with Hale and Bullock again pacing the scoring, boasted the margin to 43-27. And the final quarter the "second shift" came on to breeze.

Brooks Lose To Warriors

Leading almost all the way, the Del Norte Warriors stopped a five game Brookings win streak Tuesday night 40-31 on the Crescent court.

The game evened up the series between the two. Earlier the Brooks edged out Crescent City on the local floor.

Brookings just had a cover the net in Tuesdays - action. They dumped in only eight buckets from the field, with Ron Lane, getting half of them with fouls. Jerry Anderson, Bill Workinger, Ray Hansen and Stan Gribble each added one basket. The Bullocks, Marv and Ron, normally good scorers couldn't buy a basket.

The Warriors started out slow and Brookings led at the first quarter mark with eight points. Lane contributed four free throws.

However, it was a poor second quarter that nearly ruined the locals. They could scrape up only five points, while Del Norte netted 12 for a lead which was never closed.

The Brookings JV squad saw their favorite trick — a fourth quarter spurt—used against them in their contest, as they lost 50-23.

They moved into the final period trailing only 26-28, but could manage to score only two points—a basket by Fred Anderson—while the Junior Del Norters slammed home a remarkable 22 points, to literally run away with the game.

A good third period saw Brookings move from a 7 point halftime deficit to within two points, but the fourth quarter washed out any victory hopes. Anderson was high scorer with 10, Gary Midwood added eight, and Jim Gribble had six for Brookings.
