

### Council Holds Regular Meeting

A series of resignations and appointments started off the first regular council meeting held by the new council Tuesday night under the direction of Mayor Fell Campbell.

The council accepted the resignation of office clerk, Mrs. H. M. Coates, the resignation of Al Botzek from the budget committee, and Frenchie Arrell from the budget committee. D. D. Williams was also taken off the budget committee as he has moved into Harbor.

The council also read the resignation of Dot Martin as city engineer, but a motion was made that the mayor be granted permission to re-appoint Martin as city engineer, on the same basis, a \$109 a month retainer fee.

Two were appointed to the budget committee by the council. They were: Clive Manley, former councilman and Bob Dimmick, former Brookings mayor. Manley will succeed Williams and Dimmick will succeed Botzek.

The fifth vacancy on the budget committee was not named pending investigation. The remainder two are Murry Palmer and Archie Hendricks.

The council session was short, ending before 10 p.m.

Earl Breuer was named president of the council and Lee Hein was named finance chairman.

Art Bollinger was up to discuss the delay in laying the laterals an Art street. The council said that they would be done as soon as the main sewer line is put in.
