## County Agent Reports on Trees

A strong demand for seedling trees for forest plantings this fall plus the hard freeze in November, 1955 has almost exhausted the supply of salable trees at the Oregon State Forest Nursery at Corvallis, says Lou Oester, county extension agent.  
 The nursery is out of all conifers except three year-old Port Orford cedar. The broad leaf species which include Cascara, Chinese elm, Russial mulberry and Russian olive and still available.  
 The price for trees at the state nursery ranges from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per 1000, depending on the species. These trees must be planted outside of city limits since they are for forestry and windbreak purposes. Order forms can be secured at the county agent's office says Oester.  
 Increased demands for seedlings for forestry and Christmas tree plantings has brought about an expansion of the Oregon State Forest Nursery. A thirty acre tract was recently cleared and is being prepared for planting. Production of trees at the nursery is expected to double in the next two years.

## 231 Businesses Now in Curry

A total of 231 merchantile businesses were recorded for Curry county when the physical count of names and businesses listed in the November, 1956 Reference Book of Dun & Bradstreet was completed.  
 According to J. Harry White, district manager of the Portland office, these were rated businesses since the Reference Book lists commerial enterprises—manufacturers, wholesalers, retailers and other businesses generally buying on credit. It does not, however, include some service and professional establishments such as real estate brokers, barber and beauty shops, stock broker, etc. Thus, figures for all businesses in Curry county would be higher than the ones quoted above.  
 The following are number of businesses in major cities of the county: Brookings 88; Gold Beach 68 and Port Orford, 33.

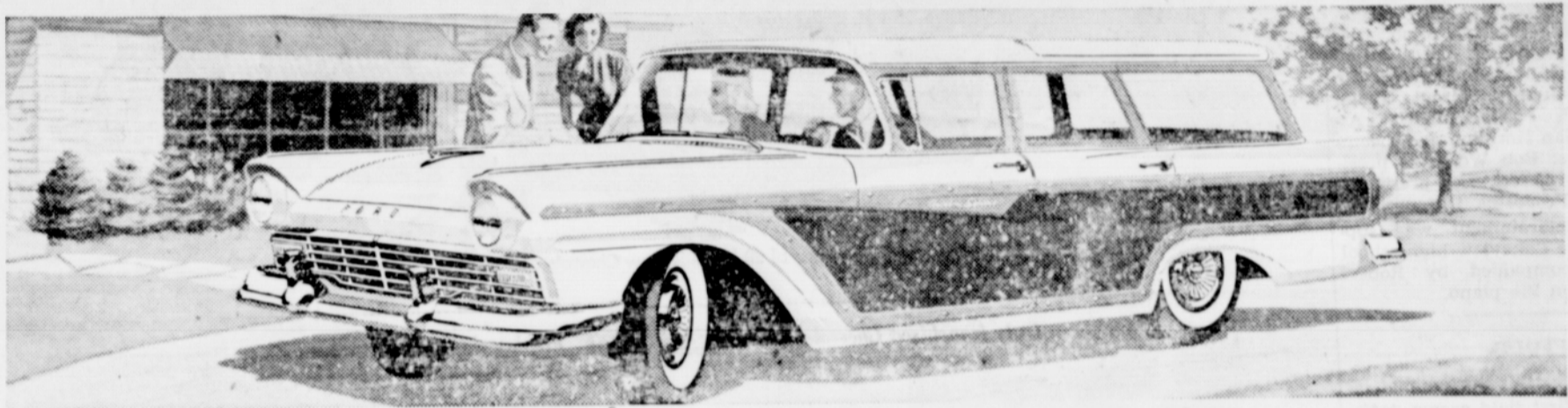

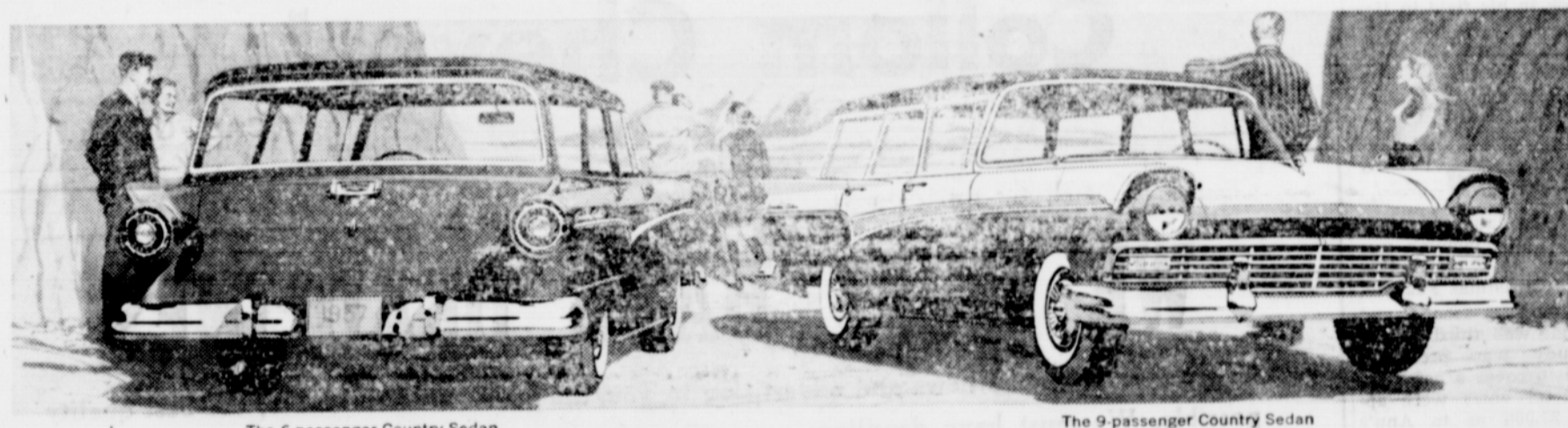

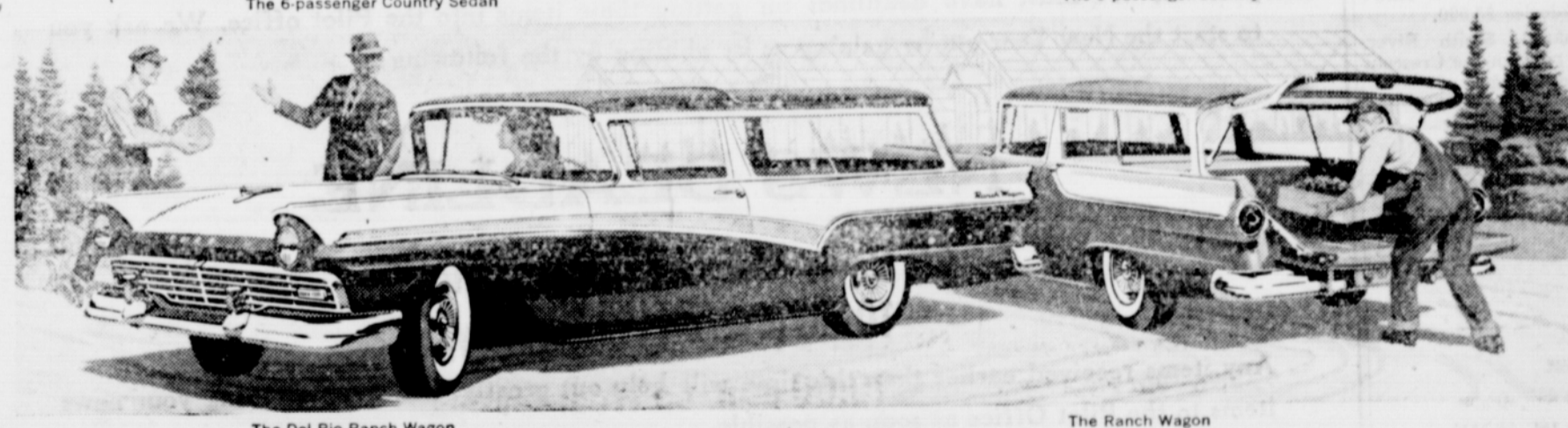
