**Community Announces "Great Decisions"**

Brookings-Harbor citizens, both as individuals and as members of more than a dozen local organizations and institutions will take part in statewide discussions of key issues in U. S. foreign policy, beginning January 20, it was announced here today by Mr. Joe Zumpfe, committee chairman.

A number of local organizations today formed a committee in the community for a Great Decisions program. Its function will be to coordinate public activities, establish informal home discussion groups, and arrange special events during the Great Decisions program. The first of these events to be held on Tuesday, January 15 at eight p.m. in the Brookings-Harbor high school library, at which time two films will be shown—one on the Middle East:

"Powder Keg on the Rim of the Communist World" and a picture titled "Leaving It to the Experts". Every interested person is invited to attend this event.

"Great Decisions . . . 1957" is a once-a-year review by the public of crucial foreign policy issues which, in the opinion of a national committee of experts, demand attention and decisions on the part of the American people.

On a state-wide basis in Oregon, the Great Decisions program is sponsored by the Oregon State college extension service in cooperation with the Foreign Policy Association, the general extension division of the state system of higher education, state library and the state department of Education.

Here in the Brookings-Harbor community the following leaders have been appointed: Erskine Miller, discussion group chairman; Mrs. Arthur Knox and Mr. Shirley McLaughlin, publicity; Web. Hibbard, material distribution; Ralph Fowler, school co-ordinator; Mrs. Arthur Knox, library; Rev. Henry Ostermeier, churches; Mrs. A. V. Moore, home economics extension co-ordinator; Walter Wolfram, special events chairman.

Basic discussion materials, designed for use by the average citizen, are prepared by the Foreign Policy Association, a national non-partisan, non-governmental educational organization.

During eight weeks of community-wide study and discussion, individual participants in the program will be able to express their opinions on each of the issues by use of an "Opinion Ballot". Tabulated results of the ballot will be published locally. Ballot results will be forwarded to congress and to the state department in Washington.

Our local group leaders met with and received instruction from Mrs. Maud Walker, group development expert from Oregon State college, Mrs. Mabel Mack, assistant director of extension service, Mr. Louis Oester and Mr. W. L. Anderson, the two Curry county extension agents.
