Brooks Split; Down Arcata

The Brookings Bruins had another split week end last week, as they lost to Phoenix in a Rogue league tilt 55-53, and then came roaring back to whip Arcata, California by a 47-36 count.

The game against Phoenix on the Brookings court Friday was an exciting encounter as the community has seen all year. The

Brooks turned on the heat in the first quarter to pour a fantastic 21 points through the hoop, while Phoenix could make but 14. Marv Bullock made nine points in that period, while Ron Bullock added five, Bill Workinger four and Jerry Anderson three.

In an attempt to run Phoenix, coach Cal Pace inserted a new

group of boys in the second quarter and Phoenix pulled ahead to a one point lead at the half, 26-25. But it was in the early part of the third period that the Brooks let the Pirates take a lead, which was as high as eight points at one time.

The last quarter started off with the Brooks trying to make up a five point deficit—and they nearly succeeded. They pushed through seven baskets in the final frame, but only once did they tie the game and that tie was quickly

erased. With only one second to play Jerry Anderson came into possession of the ball far down court. He let fly with an overhead baseball pitch, and the ball hit the backboard and nearly went through as the horn sounded.

The Brooks easily outscored the Pirates from the field, 21 to 16, but free throw percentages won the game. Phoenix made 23 gift tosses for a .742 average, while the Brooks could do no better than an even .500.

Marv Bullock finished with 15 points, Ron Bullock 11, Workinger 10, Jerry Anderson 7, Lane 5 and Stan Gribble 4.

JV Team Splits

The JV squad went into reverse from the Varsity, as they beat Phoenix fairly handily, 39-29, but dropped their outing with Arcata 55-44.

They took a 9-6 first quarter lead and never were headed, with Dale Rutledge again high with 15 points, while Fred Anderson added 11, Jim Gribble eight, and Jim Campbell four.

Against a strong Arcata JV squad it was a little different story as the Junior Tigers slammed in 18 points in the first quarter, while the Brooks could get only 12. The Junior Bruins made a determined bid in the final quarter, swishing in 19 points with Jerry Fox getting 10 of them but it wasn't enough to overcome the long lead piled up by Arcata. Rutledge and Fox each hit for 11 points, while Anderson got seven, and Jim Gribble four.

Down Arcata

After the smoke had cleared away in the first quarter, Arcata wasn't any problem for the Bruins. They pushed in only nine points in that period, but limited the Tigers to a mere one point in a poor exhibition of shooting. By half time, 13 minutes of play, Arcata had contributed just one basket, and had 11 points on the board.

The Bruins were doing a little better. They had a 21 point total by halftime, with Stan Gribble and Bill Workinger providing most of the punch.

Arcata did no more than stay about even with the Brooks in the second half—but then it was too late. The Bruins shot a neat 41.5 percent from the field on the Arcata gym, with Gribble leading with 13 points, Workinger hitting 10, Marv Bullock 9, Jerry Anderson 6, Lane 5, and Ron Bullock and Jerry Fox each two

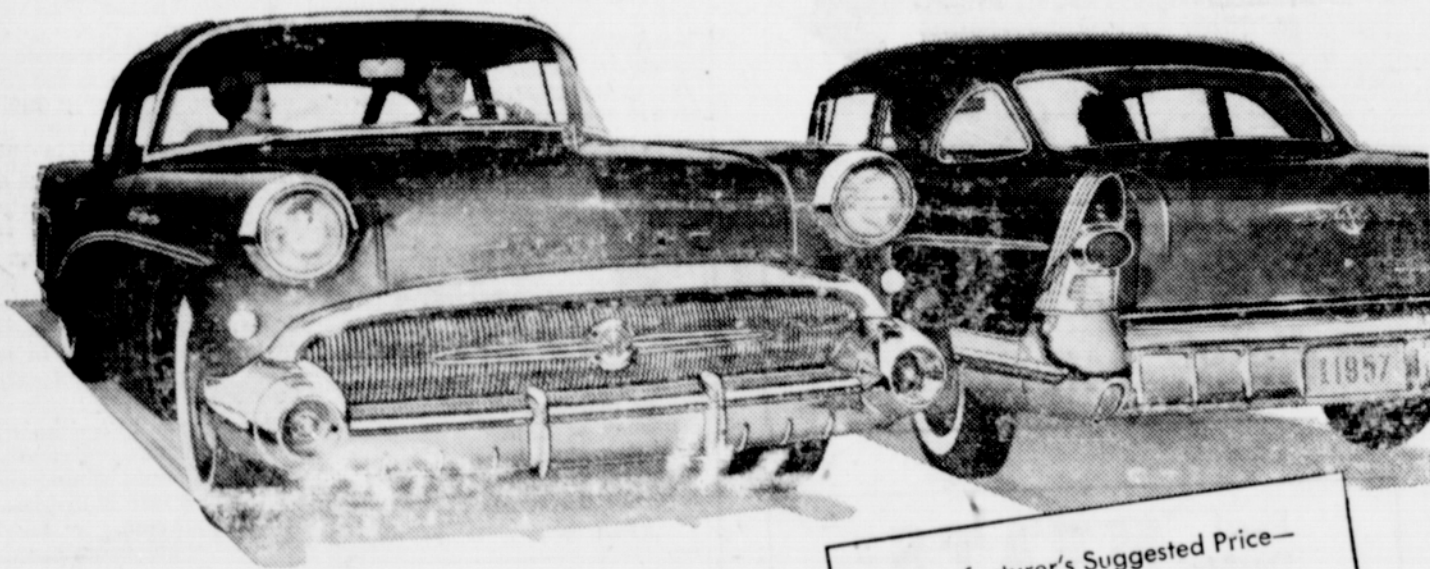
