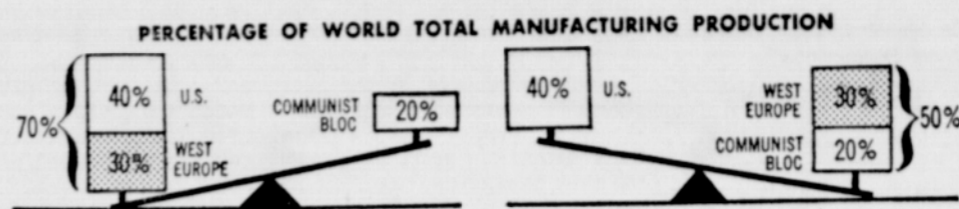

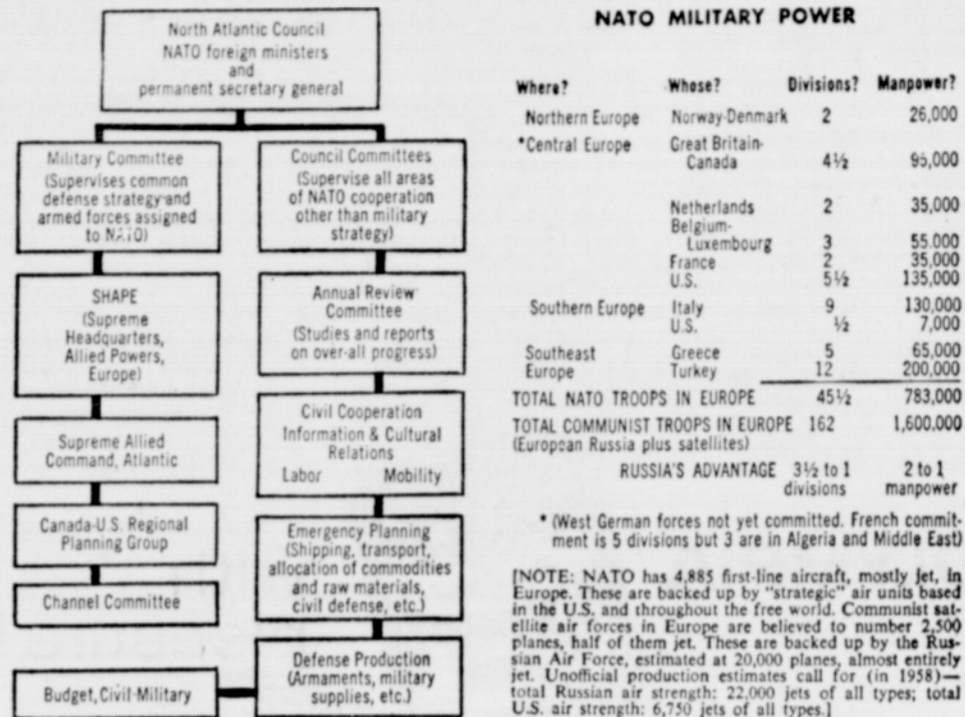

Despite Local Balminess Brookings Area Has Extremely Late Season

Despite local balminess, this is one of the latest growing seasons in many years. All plant life is hesitating in dormancy.

Usually, daffodil blooms are going from the local fields to market, beginning the first week in January, and normally, by this time, the cut is just tapering off. Presently, very few blooms have appeared. According to reports, this is a condition which prevails in the entire coastal area where daffs are grown. They are not coming into the market from the fields below San Francisco and, of course, not maturing in the fields north of here. The only blooms available are those forced under glass, and these are very few, owing to unprofitable ventures along this line last year, when the forced and the outdoor blooms came on all at the same time.

If the weather does not turn more favorable, according to some of the growers, and warm weather comes onto the whole coastal area all at once, the market will be flooded, although reports say, some blooms can be held in cold storage.

While lilies are likewise slowed in growth, the cold will not materially effect them. It has delayed some of the work in the fields, the growers usually having, by this time, ridged up the rows flattened in the winter storms, but they have enough time to make

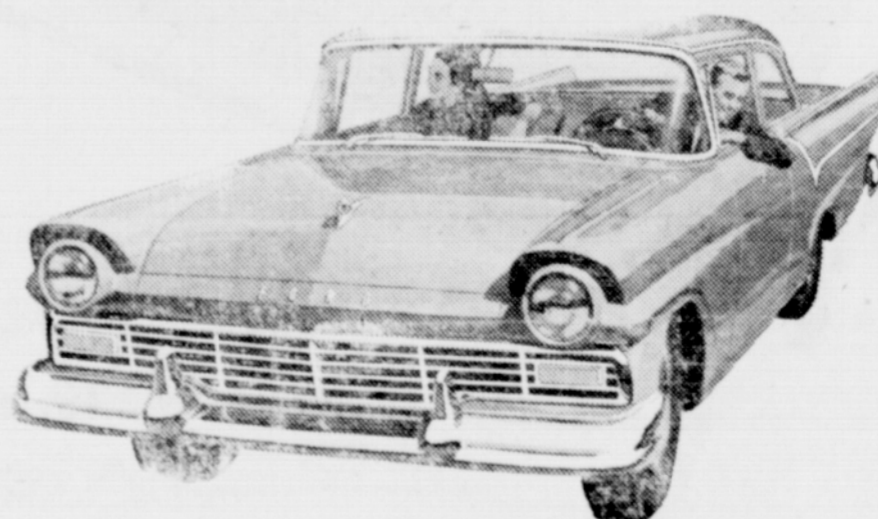
