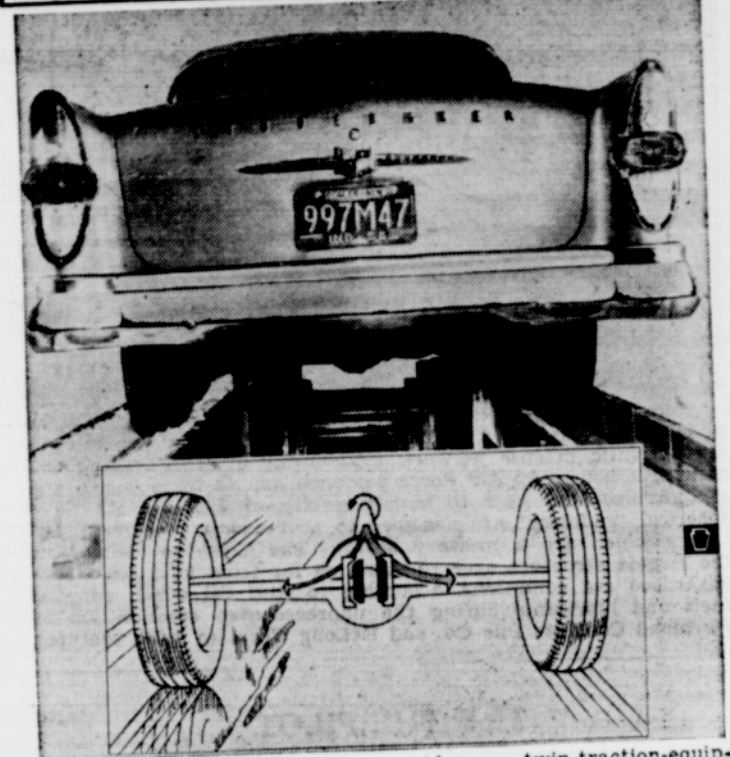

Motorists Go With Twin Traction



Sixty-four per cent of Stude-
baker-Packard orders this month
call for the new twin-traction
differential which was intro-
duced in the low priced car
field for the first time this year
by the company, Carl K. Revelle,
general sales manager, has re-
ported.

He attributed this unpre-
cedented public acceptance for
an engineering development in
its first year to the fact that
the power-dividing differential
is proving itself to be the most
important safety and driving
control advancement for 1957.
It's been shown particularly
useful as winter winds bring
ice, snow or mud to most of
the nation.

Under adverse road conditions
which is easiest to turn, re-
sulting in useless wheel spinning
and slipping.

Above a twin-traction-equip-
ped Studebaker climbs a ramp
with a 25 per cent grade despite
the fact the left wheel is em-
bedded in snow. The arrows in
the line drawing show how the
major engine force flows to the
wheel with the best traction.
The differential, optional on all
Studebaker and Packard Clipper
V-8 models, also protects against
skids when one wheel hits a
slippery spot on the highway. It
improves roadability on sharp
turns by applying driving force
to the inside rear wheel; reduces
side sway and swerve on rough
or washboard roads. It also gives
positive steering control when
one rear wheel goes off the
pavement by shifting power to
the other wheel; and reduces
tire wear.
