## Gordon Sund Enters Army

Gordon D. Sund, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl M. Sund, of Box 476, Brookings, Oregon has enlisted in the U. S. Army on February 7, 1957 for the Army Security Agency according to SFC Richard L. Johnson of the U. S. Army Recruiting Station, located at 566 N. Broadway, CoCos Bay, Oregon.

Sund will complete basic training at Fort Ord, California after which he will return home on leave then he will report to the Army Security Agency center at Fort Devens, Mass., for secondary training and schooling.

Sund enlisted under the "Choice not Chance" enlistment program whereby a person is assured his choice of service in the U. S. Army prior to enlistment, Sgt. Johnson explained.
