**Extension Courses Are Due Here**

Two extension courses are to be given in the Brookings area in the near future. Both courses are open to the public, it was announced by Curry County school superintendent John E. Seger, and Brookings Supt. D. D. Williams.

The course, Alcohol Studies in the School Curriculum, is being taught by Dr. Ken Ferrier, who is a nationally known consultant in alcohol education, having participated as a consultant in the Yale University summer school workshop on this subject.

The time of the first meeting is at 7 p.m. in the Brookings high school. The course will be 10 meetings, and require a \$24 fee. Three hours of graduate or undergraduate credit will be given. This course would be of particular interest to ministers, Sunday School teachers as well as laymen. The second course, Oregon School Law and Organization, will be taught by Ed Sever, county superintendent. Meeting time will be at 7 p.m. beginning on March 27, with seven meetings to be held. Two hours of undergraduate credit will be given. The fee will be \$16.

A third course, History of the Pacific Northwest, will be given in Gold Beach only, with Dr. Bill McLean as instructor.
