Reports to Rotary On Russia Trip

Roy J. Hansen, manager, Eureka Travel Agency, and a recent visitor to the Soviet Union was guest speaker Tuesday at the regular noon meeting of the Brookings Rotary Club at the Cliff House.

Hansen told the group candidly that the people in the Soviet Union "never had it so good", but emphasized the fact that they never had anything to begin with, so that it seems good to them, although they are a long way behind the U. S. in almost every respect.

He reported a lack of "freedom of movement", and of "freedom of speech", but said that TV sets were fairly common, in Moscow at least and other living standards were low compared to us, but they were making progress.

Hansen made a months trip through Russia alone, telling the group that the average Russian worker receives only one fourth the U. S. pay, and finds prices six times as high, and the quality lower.

Laura Vincent Passes Away

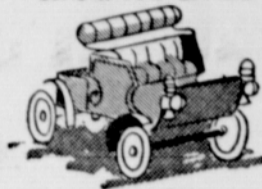

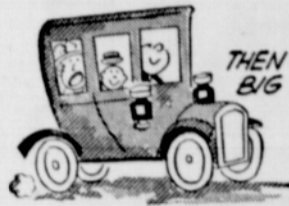
