Extension Classes to Begin Next Week

General Extension Division evening classes in Coos and Curry counties for sprint term, which begins the week of March 25, will be scheduled in Bandon, Brookings, Coos Bay, Drain, Gold Beach, Port Orford and Reedsport.

Two extension courses are to be given in the Brookings school. Both courses are open to the public. Dr. Kenneth Ferrier, Assistant Professor of Education, General Extension Division, will conduct classes in Alcohol Studies in the School Curriculum in Brookings high school, Wednesday beginning on March 27. Classes will meet from 7:00 to 9:45 p.m. and offer three undergraduate credit hours.

The course would be of particular interest to ministers, Sunday school teachers as well as laymen.

The second course, Oregon School Law and Organization will be taught by Ed Seger, county school superintendent. Meeting time will be at 7:30 p.m. on March 27, with seven meetings to be held at the high school.
