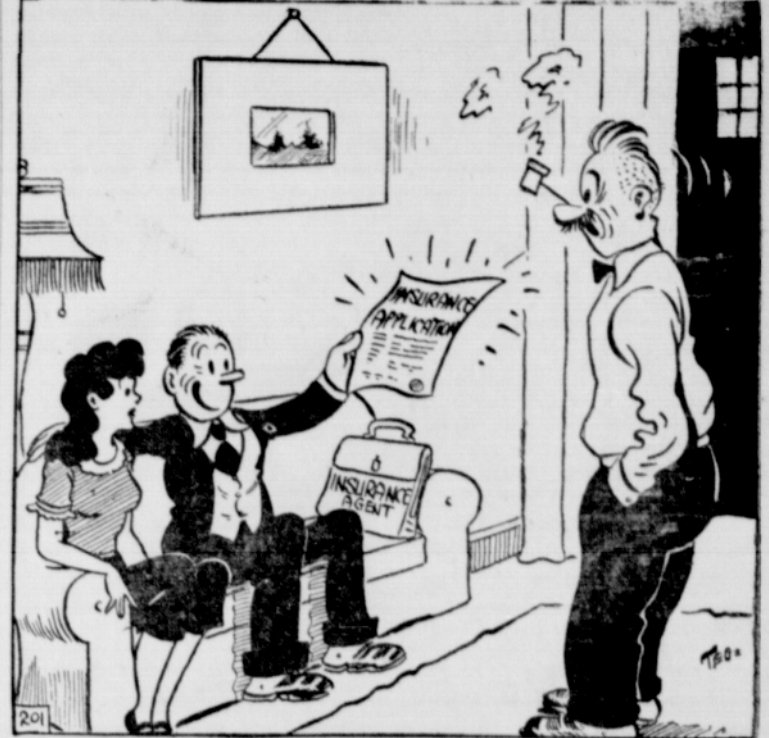
Mr. and Mrs. Frank Fungler and three children returned home Friday from Tacoma where they had visited with friends.
