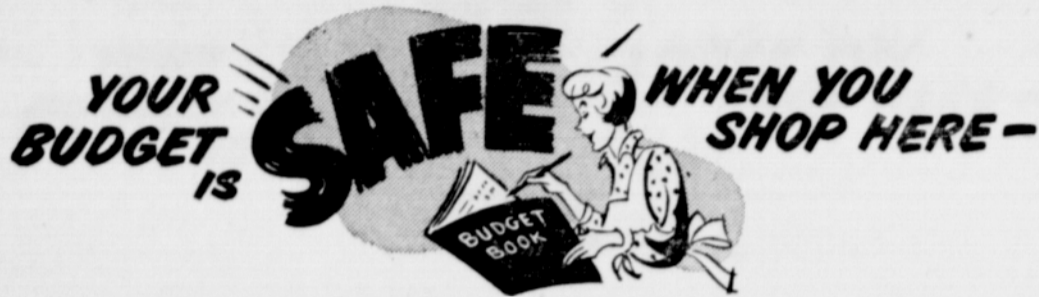

The Brookings Chamber of Commerce board of directors, blackjacks in hand, this week are looking for a writer of the Travel Information Division of the Oregon State Highway Department.

At least the directors would like to take the writer by the hand and show him the city of Brookings.

The reason for the ire (mostly kidding) is a four column story (with pictures) of the Oregon Coast, which appeared in the travel section of the Berkley Daily Gazette last Thursday.

The story was a wonderful one, with the banner headline "Oregon Coast Abounds with Colorful scenery and fine recreation spots".

For two full galleys of type, which started off "Oregon's breezy coast from the Chetco River and the colorful Azaleas in the south to Gearhart and the Astor Column in the north" the story told of the many beauties of the coast. But lo—every city, village, and hamlet was mentioned except Brookings and Harbor. Not a line, not a word.

And there, oh dastardly deed, two pictures illustrating the beautiful "coast" showed Timberline Lodge and Multnomah Falls, neither of which are mentioned in the story.

The story is an interesting one which goes on to tell the following information: "The whole family will find pleasure here, for most of the coastline is decked with clean sand, and all but a few files of the beach are state-owned and open to the public.

"Vistas overlooked by high cliffs, rugged promontories and surf-washed rock formations com-

"The Chetco River in the south is one of Oregon's prettiest fishing streams, and is a favorite for trout and salmon. Azaleas in Azalea State Park bloom brightly in spring.

"Azalea Park is the first of a succession of state parks and waysides ideally situated along the Oregon Coast. Camping and trailer sites, picnic tables and viewpoints are offered in parks such as Harris Beach, etc."

The article tells all about Wed-

derburn, Gold Beach and Agness, Bandon, Coos Bay, and every city to the north. But no Brookings.
