Lumber Prices Move Upward

Hopes for an improved green lumber market were raised last week when several prices rose sharply, according to Random Lengths, Eugene weekly lumber market letter.

So far, however, studs are the only item that has taken a big jump upward, and reaction to recent price increases for other items of green lumber, although slight, has caused many buyers to withhold buying temporarily.

While some might attribute this upturn as the beginning of the traditional Spring buying surge, others take the more realistic approach that low production has now fallen slightly behind demand. Any additional production, inspired by improved prices, could easily return the market to its low position of several weeks ago.

Mixed car mills shipping both green and kiln dried lumber report a slight improvement in inquiries and buying this past week, and all signs point toward a moderate but steady increase in market volume.

The Pine market also showed signs of modest improvement. While there has been no startling activity, mills generally have been able to improve their un-filled order position.

Pine Selects are moving in fair volume, and the shop market is reasonably stable, but has shown no strengthening of prices. Commons in the higher grades and wider widths are the fastest moving items in the Pine market.

Plywood plants report good order files for sanded stock on the \$72 basing price for quarter-inch AD, and demand for sheathing has picked up at mills on four-day work week schedules.

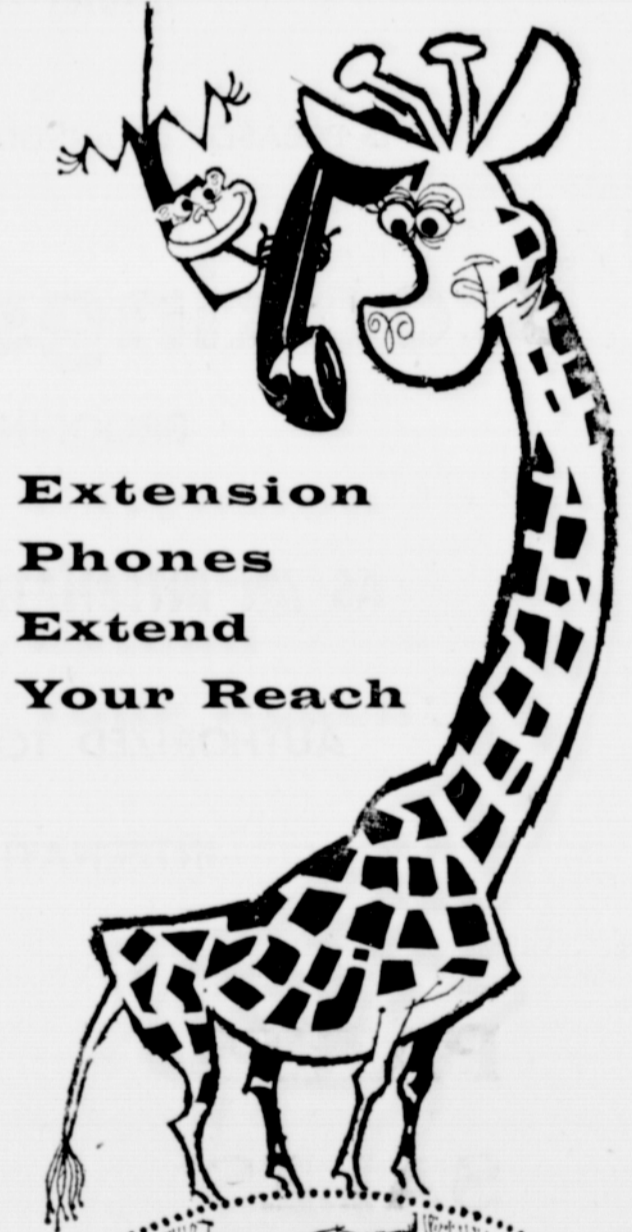
