Wire Tells of Research Aid

A telegram received by the Pilot Wednesday from Sen. Richard Neuberger, and Representative Charles Porter indicated the possibility of receiving \$2500 for local research on the Symphulid disease, currently a pain in the neck for lily bulb growers here.

The wire reported that the U. S. Department of Agriculture assured them that the money would be made available, providing the Agriculture Dept. funds are not reduced. The money would become available after July 1.

The telegram read as follows: To Brookings-Harbor Pilot: Conferred Tuesday with U. S. Agriculture Dept. office concern-

ing Symphulids harming lily bulbs, Oriental crops and vegetables, assured \$2,500 available for research work July 1, if U. S. D. A. appropriation not reduced. Working with U. S. D. A. to find semi-experienced men to conduct experimental work in area with Charles F. Doucette of Sumner, Wash. Symphulid problems concern of U. S. D. A. here.

Regret to tell you U. S. D. A. will not move Sumner office to Brookings-Harbor area, although they appreciate offer by Curry County Court and Pacific Bulb Growers Association.
