**MAYOR APPOINTS TWO MEN**

Mayor Fell Campbell appointed two men, Emmett Gulley, and Bob Stanhurst to the planning commission Tuesday night, at the regular meeting of the Brookings Council. Stanhurst was a re-appointment. One other appointment is still needed for the commission. Roy Weideman, and Fred Fox are both leaving the group.

The council also heard discussion on the non payment by the Brookings Water Co. on the 2 per cent franchise tax which was levied on that firm. A motion was made to instruct the city attorney, W.W. Balderree to investigate the matter, and make collection.

Gordon Goetz, of the Planning Commission appeared before the council to state that they felt that the re-zoning at the River mouth could have been given more thought. The planning commission didn't take action, pending clarification. Goetz said that the group felt that the public is entitled to an access to the jetty, and felt that the re-zoning should have taken that into consideration.

Mayor Campbell said that they would discuss an easement with the property owner, Elmer Bankus so that the public would have a means

of getting to the jetty.

The council accepted the Planning Commission recommendation that a recommendation be sent to the county court asking that a county-wide planning commission be set up.

It was brought out that parking meters were being put in out in North Brookings shopping area.

The council also agreed to renew the contract with the Harbor Rural Fire Protection District which would insure that area of fire protection from the city equipment, at a cost of \$378.00 a year, plus \$25 additional for more than eight fires.

Discussion was also held on final payments to Pelican Bay for the work on the sewers. It was agreed to issue warrants for the full amount due, \$9,000, less \$1,000, for the clean-up necessary, when the contract is fulfilled.
