Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 17C of Curry County, State of Oregon, from 2 p. m. to 8 p. m. on May 9, 1957, at High School in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1957-1958 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: Increasing school costs and continued increase in enrollment.
