Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon beginning at 2:00 p. m. May 21, 1957, for all merchantable timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing about 122 acres located in a general sale area of 480 acres, more or less, within Sections 28, 29, 32, and 33, T. 40 S., R 12 W., W. M., unsurveyed, in the Wheeler Creek drainage, Siskiyou National Forest, Ore. The estimated volumes are 5700 M bd. ft. of Douglas-fir and redwood, 20 M bd. ft. of western hemlock and other species. The minimum acceptable bid per M bd. ft. is as follows: Douglas-fir and redwood--\$26.55, western hemlock and other species - \$1.80 This includes the following stumpage rates, per M bd. ft.; Douglas fir and redwood - \$25.75, western hemlock and other species - \$1.00 plus \$0.60 for sale area betterment and \$0.20 for slash disposal for all species. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 P. M., May 21 1957. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. A money order, bankdraft, cashier's or certified check in the sum of \$9,000 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in

writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and submission of bids should be obtained from the District Ranger, Brookings, Oregon or the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon before bids are submitted.
