The Oregon Broadcasting Company of Grants Pass has asked the Federal Communications Commission to assign television Channel 6 to Brookings. W. W. Baldaree of Brookings and Grants Pass is vice-president and director of Oregon Broadcasting. Wm. B. Smullin is secretary.

The company is affiliated with KBES TV at Medford and with KIEM-TV at Eureka.

If the Commission does allocate Channel 6 to Brookings, Oregon Broadcasting will immediately request authority to install and operate a television station at Brookings which will give TV service to Curry County.

The bullet caused injury to her spleen, and she had to have it removed. She received six pints of blood, but was reported to be getting along nicely now.

When Mr. Ross returned home he found little Stevie had locked himself in the bathroom, but he managed to talk him out.
