

**OESTER ANNOUNCES NEW ORDER PLANS**

Farmers and ranchers in Curry County can now buy lime and fertilizer to be used on A. C. P. practices on a purchase order plan, reports Lou Oester, County Extension Agent.

The decision to adopt this practice was reached at the last meeting of the Curry County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee.

This plan enables a farmer to complete a

practice with less cash outlay at planting time.

The A. S. C. share amounts to seventy five percent of the cost of lime. On fertilizer the rate is fifty per cent of the cost, not to exceed four dollars per acre. A soil test is required.

Purchase orders can also be used on practice requiring custom machine hire, such as ditching and bulldozer or dragline use. In this case the operator of the machinery must sign a operators agreement
