LAWN PLANT AT GOLD BEACH

A lawn planting trial established in 1954 in front of the Gold Beach Grade school still shows what the right kind of grass can do in this area, reports Lou Oester, County Extension Agent. The trial plots are two tenths of an acre each and different kinds of bentgrass and fescue were planted. The bentgrasses planted alone look very poor at this time. However, the plots containing a mixture of bentgrass and the fine fescues look excellent. The best plots contain one pound

of either Astoria or Highland bentgrass plus three pounds of Chewings or Red Creeping fescue per 1,000 square feet.

Homeowners who plan to plant a lawn can get complete information on planting, fertilizing, and maintaining a lawn from Ore. Experiment Station Bulletin Number 516 "Home Lawns for Ore." This bulletin is available at the county extension office.
