

LIBRARY BOARD MEETS

At the monthly meeting of the Chetco Library Trustees held Monday evening, the 1957-58 budget was put in shape. The library has now been operating long enough for the board to get a better idea of its costs and the figure submitted for plant operation and book purchase is somewhat lower than the guessed sums of 1956-57. The budget is set up to pay a librarian \$600 during the year. This sum does not increase, by that amount, next year's figures over last years.

Ben Jones gave a very helpful report of his meeting with other library trustees of the state held at Portland, visiting the State Librarian, and looking into the operation of the Douglas County library at Roseburg. He brought back a sample by-laws, which will be used in the local library. Ben said it was a surprise to some that he actually represented an Oregon library.

The librarian, Mrs. Spence Freeman, was directed to proceed toward enforcement of the state laws concerning the misuse of library facilities by patrons failing to return, when due, borrowed books or mutilation of volumes from the shelves. Violations are punishable by fines or imprisonment. The librarian was also instructed not to issue borrowers cards to children under 16 unless applied for, in person, by the parent or guardian.
