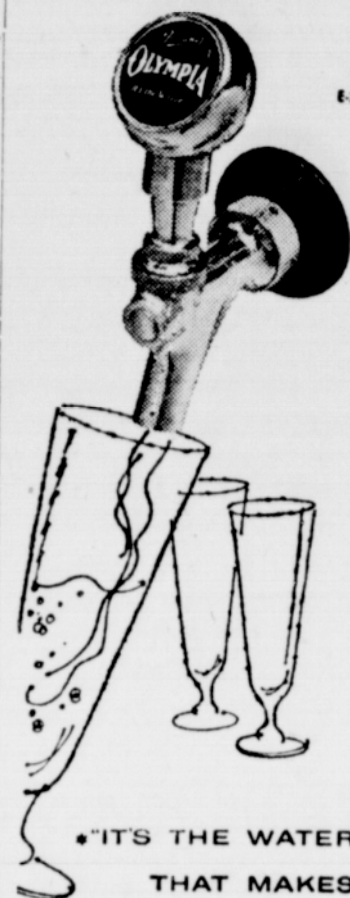
CAN FOLLOW IKE'S CAR
