FIRES COST 150 MILLION

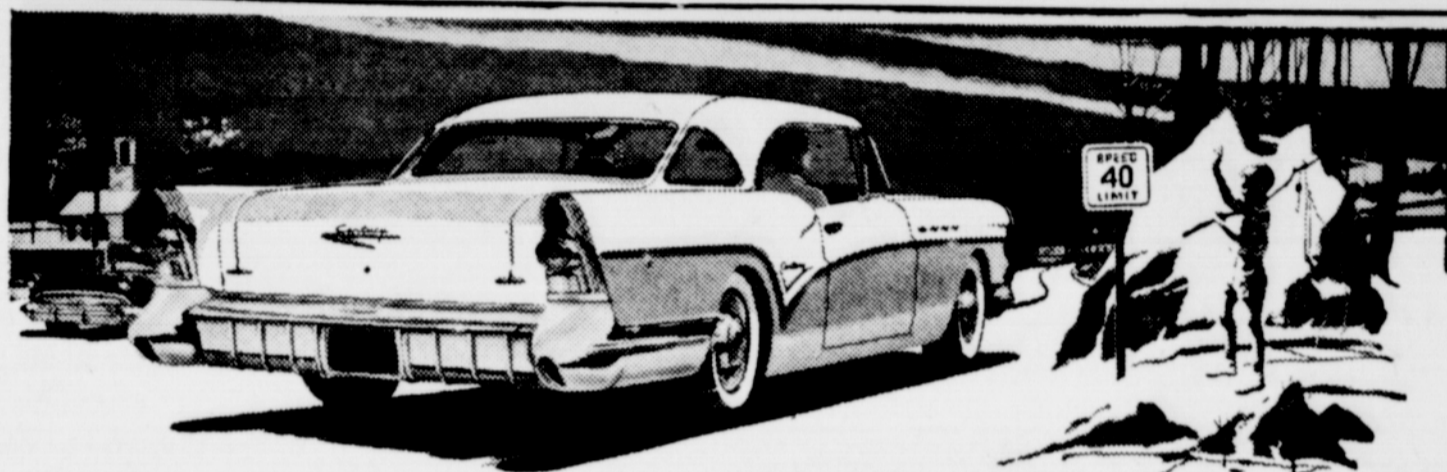

Most fires in this area are caused by defective heating systems, defective wiring, misuse of electricity, matches, and smoking. On many farms and in many homes electrical gadgets have been added with no consideration to the initial capacity. During spring "Cleanup-Fixup Week" is a good time to make out a check list and help keep down the number of fires and accidents on our farms and in our homes.
