THANKS FOR A JOB WELL DONE

With the passage of the Highway bond bill, which will provide some \$12,600,000 for the relocation of Highway 101 in Curry County, and with the recent awarding of the jetty construction bids, we as a community, should look about to find some one to thank for our good fortunes. SUCH THINGS DON'T JUST HAPPEN!

First the Highway. We feel that Sen. Dick Chapman, and our assemblyman, Carl Back, did the most important work in this. We think that Chapman's newsletter, on another page of this week's Pilot, makes this evident. We think that they did a real service in engineering the bill through their respective houses, and we, for one, wish to place a good deal of credit on their shoulders, putting all partisan policies aside. We are highly indebted to these gentlemen, and we herewith express our appreciation.

The Oregon Coast Association, and more particularly, Vern Ayres, the group's manager, deserves more than a passing nod of the head, too. They helped to instigate the bill, and the publicity job they did was superb. This is the sort of thing we want the Association to do and because they took it by the horns and did it, we feel they merit vigorous support by the merchants of the area.

Thirdly, we would like to commend a local group, the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce, for their long range interest in the measure. We know, for example, the current board of directors of the Chamber did more work on the bill than a lot of people realize, and we know that ground work has been in progress on some type of legislation for many years. The Chamber has kept an awareness of Curry County's problems before the powers that be for many years.

On the jetty, we don't have to look too far to see where to tip our hats in humble thanks. We think that the now dissolved Chetco River Mouth group had more to do with the project than any other organization, in the 20 odd years that Brookings has been after the jetties. Such men as Ed Ackley, Wilson Freeman, Dr. Roy White, Clive Manley, Murry Palmer, and others contributed a good deal of time and money. Many other businesses also kicked in money when it was needed.

Freeman, in particular has been interested in the project for many, many years, and the actual awarding of the contract is a fitting tribute to years of perseverance and effort on his part.

We are, of course, aware that other played important roles in securing these important contributions to the community. And to all of them--from the Pilot--and from residents of the Brookings-Harbor area, for whom we'd like to speak, we want to extend a very warm and sincere "Thank you for a job well done."

SIX FILE FOR SCHOOL BOARD.
