## SOIL SPECIALIST TO VISIT HERE

L. V. Davenport of Grants Pass, I. D. Nicholas of Portland, and R. McLauchlan of Hillsboro spent Tues. of last week working with D. C. Greeves of the local Soil Conservation Service office. These three men are specialists with the Soil Conservation Service and spent the day checking on four grass and legume planting trials throughout the county. These trials were set out to determine the adaptability of new species to local conditions and are set out in Brookings, Port Orford, and the Sixes area.
