QUEEN JACKIE TO REIGN

The Festival will open Saturday, with the coronation ceremony set for 11:45 AM at the Park. Dozens of events are planned for the two day show, sponsored by the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce.

Queen Jackie Smith will reign over the 18th Azalea Festival beginning Saturday in Brookings. The announcement was made this week by Festival Chairman, Speed Funari.

Details are being ironed out for the Festival, which will open as usual with the Pet Parade at 10:00 A. M.

Everything is included in this years show, including a gigantic flower and art show, a gem and mineral show, an elaborate coronation ceremony, with C. F. Armstrong, State Suot. of Parks, as Guest Speaker.

There will be a fine group of entertainers down from Eureka, headed by John LaBuona. Saturday afternoon, the hungry throng will be treated to a Queen's Smorgasbord, under the direction of Mrs. Carl Johnson, and the Chetco Grange Ladies. Saturday night there will be a Queen's ball.

Sunday, the church services will be held in the Park. Also, Sunday morning will be the annual Lion's Club Boat Races, which normally draws a large crowd, and boats from all over the state.

At 12:30 Sunday will be the barbecue, served under the watchful eye of the Chef of the West, Vic Reynolds.

The Pet Parade chairman, Don Ross, announced that they would kick the parade off from in front of the Mobil Station, at 10:00 AM, with the line-up to begin at 9:30.

The coronation ceremony, in which Queen Jackie will be crowned, will begin at 11:45. John LaBuona will be Master of Ceremonies at the following program, which will bring Dianne Brown, the Rio Cords, and Ron Walters on stage in a variety of TV talent.
