

### MOORE OBITUARY REPORTED

### DISABLED WORKERS WARNED TO FILE

Disabled workers in the Brookings area who have not yet filed to establish their disability under the social security law should do so as soon as possible. Carlos L. Hunsinger, manager of the Eureka social security office emphasized today that failure to file an application before July 1 of this year may result in loss of benefits.

Monthly cash disability benefits are payable for July 1957 to qualified workers 50 years old or older. Benefits should be applied for by June 30, 1957, if the worker became totally disabled and has not worked since before January 1955. The principal requirement is a severe disability after at least five years of earnings covered by social security.

June 30 of this year is also an important deadline date for workers under age 50 who have been disabled for prolonged periods. Individuals who do not apply to freeze their social security records by that time may forfeit their rights to disability benefits at age 50, to old-age benefits, or benefits to their survivors.
